
In PSHE, Reception have been learning all about sharing and turn-taking, helping them build those important social skills.

This week has been filled with exciting learning experiences! The children have been exploring the use of rhetorical questions in their letters, as they write from Hogarth's perspective to save the Iron Man. It's wonderful to see their creativity shine through in their writing!

In maths, our Year 2 students have been mastering addition and subtraction by making 10 and tackling three-digit numbers. Year 3 is focusing on the connections between addition and subtraction, while Year 4 is refining their skills by considering the most efficient methods for these operations. It's fantastic to witness their progress!

In history, we delved into the Bronze Age and discussed how life changed from the Stone Age. The children learned about the conflicts that arose with the introduction of bronze and how tribes built defences to protect themselves.

During our Design Technology lesson, our talented children used their design skills from previous weeks to create round houses using clay, straws, and various other materials. They followed the instructions brilliantly and demonstrated great teamwork and creativity.
