### Nursery - Mrs Dobson

We started our week with the classic nursery rhyme, *Incy Wincy Spider*. The children sang with enthusiasm, using hand motions to act out the spider's journey up the waterspout. This song helped build rhythm, coordination, and language skills—all while having lots of fun!

The children discovered fascinating facts like:

- Spiders have eight legs.
- Most spiders have eight eyes.
- They spin silk webs to catch their food.
- Some spiders can jump or swim!

We explored pictures, watched short videos, and even practiced counting legs and eyes on spider models. In the water tray we used pipes of different sizes and shapes, to make spouts for Incy wincy spider. The children used their counting skills to put the correct number of legs on the spider and we used play dough to make the googly eyes.

**Fingerprint Cobweb Art** - creativity took center stage as the children made cobwebs using their **fingerprints and white paint** on black paper. They carefully pressed their fingers in circular patterns.

**Giant Sticker Spider Craft** - to wrap up the week, we worked together to create a giant spider using stickers! Each child added a piece - legs, eyes, and body segments, until our spider came to life on a big poster. It was a wonderful exercise in teamwork and fine motor skills.

### YrR/1 – Miss Humpherson, Miss Anderson and Mrs Niven

What a magical and marvellous week we've had in Reception and Year 1! With Halloween in the air, the classrooms have been buzzing with excitement, creativity, and lots of learning.

Reception have been diving into the spooky tale of *Meg and Mog*, exploring the story through sequencing activities and learning some truly wonderous words! The children also had a fantastic time concocting their own witchy potions, using CVC words like bat, rat, and cat. They've been brilliant at spotting rhyming words too, building on last week's phonics fun!

Year 1 have been getting into the Halloween spirit by describing the characters from *Meg and Mog* and correcting some rather spooky sentences. Their growing confidence with sentence structure and vocabulary has been wonderful to see.

In maths, Reception have been exploring positional language—under, over, next to, and more! The highlight was definitely creating and navigating obstacle courses, guiding each other through using their new vocabulary.

Year 1 have been working hard on different strategies for adding and subtracting within 10. From number lines to part-whole models, they've shown great perseverance and problem-solving skills.

In science, Reception have been learning all about nocturnal animals. They've loved discovering which creatures come out at night and how they adapt to the dark.

Year 1 have continued their 'Seasonal Changes' topic by exploring the wonders of Autumn. They even set up their very own weather station and went on a nature walk to spot signs of the season—crunchy leaves, conkers, and chilly breezes!

To top off a fantastic half term, the children danced the night away at our Halloween Disco! With spooky costumes, music, and lots of laughter, it was the perfect way to celebrate all their hard work this term. We're so proud of everything the children have achieved this half term and can't wait to see what the next one brings. Have a restful and safe break!
